

## **Online Foundational Requirements:**

Focus is on static *delivery* of learning content; however, instructional strategies should encourage active engagement with the learning. You should assess the unit against the following core elements:

Core Elements	Moodle Examples
Content – You should:	
Provide convenor contact details & photo	Contact details block
Provide a Unit Outline	Block
Create student groups as needed, seminar/tutorial enrolment	<ul> <li>Groups/Groupings (e.g. Holmesglen, Bruce)</li> </ul>
Provide Unit content – e.g. lecture podcasts, power points, documents, readings, links to websites	<ul><li>Files</li><li>Podcasts</li><li>forums</li></ul>
Create a unit structure – coherent and easy for self-directed student to follow	<ul><li>modules/weeks</li><li>Unit schedule</li></ul>
Instructional Strategies – You Should:	
Incorporate self-directed and individual activities – particularly important to engage online learners & create a productive and positive learning environment with an ability to self-assess, providing a sense of making progress.	<ul> <li>Forums</li> <li>Wikis</li> <li>Quiz</li> <li>Choice</li> <li>Etc.</li> </ul>
Communication – You should:	
Provide a welcome message – creates a teacher presence	<ul><li>News &amp; Announcement Forum</li><li>Podcast</li></ul>
Create an <i>opportunity</i> for the cohort/s to interact and get to know other participants and the Convenor	• Forum
Assessment – You should:	
Provide details and supplementary assessment information	<ul> <li>File</li> <li>Assignment drop box description</li> <li>Marking rubric/guidelines</li> </ul>
Provide submission drop-boxes	<ul> <li>Assignment drop box</li> <li>Quiz</li> </ul>
Provide for a Unit Evaluation	Use Moodle Evaluation
